**Mahan and Watson play pivotal roles in Presidents Cup win**

As the jubilant U.S. Presidents Cup team celebrated its 19-15 victory Sunday evening, PING pros Hunter Mahan and Bubba Watson could be especially pleased with their performances. Mahan earned 4 points combined in team and individual play, second-most on the team, and his 23-foot winning putt in

Mahan was 4-1. Watson was 3-2 in the Americans' seventh victory in nine events.
